When he landed, he hit the next bump, and up he went again coming down even harder, and finally wiping out. He was getting up slowly, when he was hit by another man coming down the hill on a sled. Before he knew it, he was in the air again. This time, he felt pain rush through his shoulder when he hit the ground again.

When the snow settled, he knew something was wrong. As his friends came over to help, they notice his shoulder had separated, and a large bump was now on top of his shoulder. No questions, medical attention was needed. It was now 10 pm at night, and he needed to get down to the ER in Sheridan. One of the men there offered to drive him down to the ER; so off they went, 4,000 ft down the mountain, and an hour later they were at the ER.

It was now 2 am in the morning, and they were headed back up the mountain. The driver felt God was calling him to share the gospel with his passenger who was now relaxing in the passenger seat after a several hour ordeal. Wanting to be obedient to the Holy Spirit's calling, he proceeded to share the gospel with his passenger. His passenger listen and asked some questions as they drove back up the 4,000 ft climb to camp.

It was there on a dark, switchback mountain road, the passenger asked the driver to pull over. There sitting alongside the road late at night, the angels started celebrating as this man asked Jesus to come into his heart and be his Lord and Savior!

This story reminds me that, God will do whatever it takes to get one's attention. If the Holy Spirit would call you to share, would you be ready?
